(Public Sector Equality Duty)

#### The PSED has 3 main elements

These are:

- Eliminating discrimination and other conduct prohibited by the Equality Act 2010
- Advancing equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it
- **Fostering good relations** across all characteristics between people who do share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it

#### What are protected characteristics?

Equality Act 2010:

- Age
- Sex
- Race
- Disability
- Religion or belief<
- Gender reassignment
- Pregnancy or maternity
- Marriage and civil partnership

#### We continue to:

#### Sherbourne Fields School (SFS):
